



## **Exhibition Posters**






# **The UConn Grief Project**









# **Incident Report**




#### Think Outside the Box






#### **Punk Exhibition**

# **Art & Artifact**


In response to a brief on choosing an object from a museum, I created a book made out of plastic bags that I had collected while I was in London, UK.

## **Waste Diary: Book**

Through a personal exploration of my own waste, this project delves into our relationship with trash and its environmental impact. Over the course of four weeks, I collected the waste that I generated each day, documenting my findings and assembling them into a book. The paper used for the book was crafted from recycled materials that I had accumulated over time.







I wanted to create a physical representation of the project that would further emphasize my concept by making the podiums lower to the ground. By placing the viewer in a position where they must physically look down to engage with the work, I hope to create a sense of reflection on our individual relationship with waste. Through this project, I aim to encourage viewers to consider their own daily consumption habits and to think critically about the impact of our collective waste on the world around us.


**Waste Diary: Typeface**
